Perry v. Schwarzenegger

That is the official name of the Proposition 8 federal trial that concluded at the end of January.

The judge, Chief Judge Vaughn R. Walker, who heard the case without a jury, is gay. This is the first time being gay can be a bad thing; if he overturns Prop 8, the opposition will say it's because he's gay. Judge Walker said he would study the evidence and other briefs offered to the court before hearing final arguments, possibly in March. And even after his decision, both sides expect the case to be appealed, most likely until it reaches the U.S. Supreme Court.



Two same sex-couples are suing the enforcers of California's Proposition 8 on grounds that the gay marriage ban violates their federal constitutional rights. Thus, they want Proposition 8 overturned (don't we all?).

The plaintiffs filed their lawsuit last spring after the California Supreme Court upheld Prop 8. The plantiffs were fortunate enough to have supremo representation from lawyers David Boies and Theodore Ol-

son who argued Bush v Gore in 2000 (we won't go there).

The three major points of their side were: that marriage is a fundamental right, that depriving gay people of that right caused harm, and that "there was no societal benefit to denying gays and lesbians the right to marry."

Many of the witnesses were a list of who's who, but San Diego had cause for pride when Mayor Jerry Sanders testified. Most San Diegans know that Mayor Sanders is a conservative Republican.

At the trial, he described his transformation from gay marriage opponent to vocal critic of denying gays and lesbians the right to wed. He also recounted how he renounced his own stance on gay marriage after learning his daughter is a lesbian.

The mayor, with his daughter, Lisa Sanders, in the courtroom, de-



scribed the difficulty of confronting his own

prejudice and risking the wrath of San Diegan voters. We thank Mayor Sanders for "**doing the right thing**."

He also wanted those that made his life so miserable to be held accountable, not only for his own sake, but for those who had been and continue to be brutalized by some military personal. There was an investigation of Joseph's allegations in which his Commanding Officer was exonerated. With pressure put on the Navy with the help of Pennsylvania Congressman Joe Sestak, the investigation was reopened at the top level. Some time in February, Joseph will be in Washington DC fighting for gay and lesbian rights in the military. Thank you, Mr. Rocha.
