





#### **MEA CULPA**

A big apology from the editor for failing to mention the **National Day of Silence** in April's newsletter (it was April 16). On that day, hundreds of thousands of students nationwide took a vow of silence to bring attention to anti-LGBT name-calling, bullying and harassment in their schools.

PFLAG member Dana Harwood's student, Chelsea, observed the "Day of Silence" by not speaking the entire school day and continued her silence into the evening with her family. She is in eighth grade at Monarch School in San Diego. She wrote the following heartfelt poem:

#### Let There Be No Shame

Let there be no shame No hate No blame Support our friends We are all the same.

Gay or straight Love is love Hearts beat the same There is no shame There is no one to blame We are all people We all feel the same.

#### SOME STATES IN A STATE OF DENIAL



It's déjà vu all over again. A state giveth a right and then taketh away. One of the newly elected Virginia Gov. Bob McDonnell's first actions in office was to cancel an order that prevented state employees who were gay or lesbian from being fired from their job on the basis of their sexual orientation. Now, gays and lesbians in Virginia can be fired solely on the basis of their sexual orientation. When previous Governor Tim Kaine came into office, one of the first things he did was to add veterans and sexual orientation to the already existing non-discrimination policy. With a stroke of McDonnell's pen, the sexual orientation non-discrimination portion of the policy was gone. Luckily, the veteran one stayed. This should really come as no surprise. Previous positions from McDonnell include denouncing same-sex marriage, and a college thesis where he blamed welfare programs for creating rampant homosexuality. It would be fascinating to see a math equation on that one.

On to another state. . . Oklahoma accidentally removed religion/race protections while trying to deprive gays of rights. In October, President Obama signed The Matthew Shepard Act, expanding the reach of the 1969 hate crimes law to "authorize the Department of Justice to investigate and prosecute certain biasmotivated crimes based on the victim's actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or disability." Previously, the law only allowed for the federal prosecution of anyone who "willingly injures, intimidates or interferes with another person, or attempts to do so, by force because of the other person's race, color, religion or national origin."

State lawmakers in Oklahoma argued that the Shepard Act would trample on the free speech rights of religious leaders "who preached out against the lifestyle of the victim who was attacked." On March 10, the Oklahoma state Senate thought it was passing a bill prohibiting "local and state law enforcement agencies from sharing information about hate crimes with federal authorities if the state of Oklahoma did not recognize the crime as a hate crime by its own statutes." Oklahoma state law does not recognize "sexual orientation or gender identity" as a special class and fails to provide gay and lesbians with hate crimes protections.

But in trying to strip gays and lesbians of protection, the Oklahoma State Senate inadvertently cited the wrong section of the U.S. code. The bill stripped rights under Title 18 U.S. Code Section 245, but protections for sexual orientation and gender identity is actually under Section 249. From the bill:

"Section 24A.12. Except as otherwise provided by state or local law, the Attorney General of the State of Oklahoma and agency attorneys authorized by law, the office of the district attorney of any county of the state, and the office of the municipal attorney of any municipality may keep its litigation files and investigatory reports confidential, except they shall keep their litigation files and investigatory reports confidential upon request of any federal agency when such request is made for the purpose of an attempt to investigate or prosecute an individual or individuals pursuant to 18 U.S.C. Section 245, except for those records of any individuals convicted pursuant to Section 850 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes."

Section 245 of the Code refers to race and religious protections. Therefore, Oklahoma actually passed a statute allowing state law enforcement officials to keep information about crimes motivated by race



or religion out of the hands of federal authorities.

"The bill in its current form doesn't take away rights from gays and lesbians," Oklahoma State Senate Minority Leader Andrew Rice explained. "It takes away rights for religion and race." Rice said the error occurred during the creation of the bill.

Among other noteworthy accomplishments, Sister Jeannine has written books and produced a film, *in good conscience*. We are very grateful to Dr. Orlando Espin, who donated a copy of the film to PFLAG San Diego. We hope to show the film at one of our meetings.

These are the folks (Fred Phelps and his followers) who picket at soldiers' funerals (and recently cheered the deaths of 12 tornado victims in Mississippi,) in their minds, anything that befalls the world (i.e., war, natural disasters) is the gays' fault. Phelps and gang had visited San Diego in October, 2009, where they were met with protests.

We can only hope the homophobic parents and their children will be ordered to attend the trial.


