



TRANSGENDER DAY OF REMEMBRANCE

Wednesday, November 20 is San Diego's 11th Annual Transgender Day of Remembrance. Starting at 6:00 pm, there will be a candlelight vigil and march starting at the LGBT Center, 3909 Centre Street in Hillcrest. At 7:00 pm there will be a program in The Center's auditorium.

Also on November 20 is the 3rd Annual North County Transgender Day of Remembrance, starting at 6:00 pm at the Oceanside Civic Plaza (by the reflecting pool), 300 North Coast Highway. There will be a memorial ceremony, followed by a candle-lit procession to the North County LGBTQ Resource Center.

Remembrance was set aside to memorialize those who were killed for transgender being or perceived to be Remembrance transgender or for



being gender variant in any way. The event is held in November to honor Rita Hester, whose murder on November 28. 1998, kicked off the "Remembering Our Dead" web project and a San Francisco candlelight vigil in 1999. Rita Hester's murder, like most anti-transgender murder cases, has yet to be solved.

TWO MORE SCHOLARS: MICHAEL

The recipient of the **Stephen G. Bowersox Memorial Scholarship** is **Michael Gaffney**. This scholarship is provided through the generosity of the family of Stephen G. Bowersox and friends and co-workers of the family. Stephen was awarded a PFLAG scholarship in 2003. Jim and Donna Bowersox have committed to continual funding of the scholarship. This award is strongly predicated on social justice, demonstrated involvement and high academic achievement, as well as broad, far-reaching interests and activities.

Michael graduated from San Pasqual High School and is a freshman at the University of California, Berkeley. While at San Pasqual, he was copresident of the GSA (Gay-Straight Alliance) and active in the drama club, among other activities. He received a glowing recommendation from his English/AVID teacher. She commended Michael for being an analytical reader, a superior writer, as well as being a fun person to have in her class. He was well-liked by his peers and always encouraged people to be themselves.

"I believe that the most important issue facing the LGBT community today is marriage equality. As we progress into the 21st century, more and more people are becoming accepting of LGBT individuals, and discrimination seems to be on the decline. But, one of the most blatant remaining prejudices is that of marriage inequality. It is baffling to me that a country with such an inspiring history of civil rights achievements could allow such a self-evident, basic right to be denied. The LGBT community deserves nothing less than their right to love whomever they choose, and to start a family with that person if they desire to, all with the same benefits and entitlements as any other married couple.

To solve this issue, I believe we need to come from many different angles. From petitioning our congressmen, to rallying, to demonstrating and promoting equality in our daily lives, the LGBT community is good at putting themselves out there and demanding to be heard. But I think the most important thing that members of the LGBT community can do is proudly live their lives, pursue their dreams, and show by example that they are just like anybody else. When people start to realize that members of the LGBT community are already around them, working at their careers, participating as community leaders, buying groceries, and raising families, maybe then it will become apparent that they are no different from any other Americans.

I started a Gay-Straight Alliance club at my high school, and as I transition into

college, I plan continue participating as a member of the oncampus LGBT leadership community. It always has been important to me to get involved in what I believe



in and to try to make a positive difference. With the entrepreneurial skills I gain in my education, I can further these goals. Once in the workforce, I hope to help fuel the progression of acceptance in the workplace by making myself an open, safe person to confide in, and by participating in my company's LGBT organization.

I recently became an Eagle Scout. One more thing I plan to do, assuming that Boy Scouts of America comes through with their recent statements about allowing gays to participate openly as scouts and leaders: I want to become an adult scout leader. This is another way to demonstrate leadership and make others aware of our equality in their everyday lives."



discrimination was eliminated, the LGBT community had little chance of advancing other significant LGBT legislation, in particular marriage rights. Her feeling was, with the repeal of DADT, the floodgates would open to complete civil rights. Besides dedicating a massive amount of time to the repeal of DADT, Anna gifted in excess of a million dollars to SLDN. She described herself as being "lucky enough to have been in the right place"

ANNA M. CURREN HONORED

Bobbi Harwood (PFLAG Maven and past-president) and newsletter editor, Sherry Cohen-Richards, felt privileged and honored to be part of "An Evening to Celebrate Equality Advocate Anna M. Curren." Anna has been a PFLAG member for many, many years and has always been a gracious donor.

Anna's greatest passion since 2000 has been the SLDN (Servicemembers Legal Defense Network), which has been in existence since 1992, even

before "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" (DADT) was born in 1993. Although the agency is multi-faceted, DADT was its major focus. Anna joined the governing Board of SLDN in 2000 and didn't retire until 2010 following completion of the DADT Repeal process. While on the board, she was dedicated to reversing the six-decade old statute that prevented open LGBT service in our military. She was convinced that until this last bastion of federally authorized

TWO MORE SCHOLARS: ISAAC

Isaac Gomez is the recipient of the Rob Benzon Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship is provided through the generosity of the Rob Benzon Foundation to honor their beloved and generous friend, Rob Benzon. The goal of this scholarship is to recognize youth who demonstrate a giving spirit and charisma. Isaac completely fills that bill.

Isaac is well known to the LGBT community as an outspoken advocate extended transgender his community family. Although he only speaks about his personal transformation, he serves as an educator and a passionate activist for transgender rights. He is a role model and mentor who is comfortable speaking to a small group or a roomful of people. One of Isaac's goals is for people to learn acceptance. Isaac is in his Sophomore year at Stanford University.

"In my years as an activist for trans youth rights, I have tried to make a habit of stating that my story is not representative of all transgender people. The experience I went through and the challenges I overcame are specific to me, and although many transgender people can relate to my situation, every person has their differences. Because of this, I cannot speak broadly to identify the toughest issue confronting the LGBT community, but what I can do is share

the only experience I truly know, my own.

My greatest gift in life has been my family, and despite the unconditional love, they have never failed to provide me, I did struggle with gender identity issues from an early age. When I was younger, it seemed to be more of preference than a yearning. All my friends were boys, I enjoyed "boy" activities, and I liked the clothes in the boys' section of the department stores. If I were to pick my own name, at that time, it would've been Nicholas. However, after elementary school, it turned into something more than preference.

When I started my preteen years, I could feel my body transform everyday into something I did not recognize. Middle school years were filled with the need to be normal and I desperately embraced this phase. My parents were scared to see their youngest child, a once happy and expressive kid, closing off to the outside world.

By the time I was 12-years old, I had decided I was done with being abnormal. I wasn't going to live the rest of my life as an unhappy woman. Although my mind was made up, on September 16, 2006, I decided that I had to tell at least one person how I felt before I started this gruesome journey.

Thinking back, mγ mother was the right choice. She accepted me wholeheartedly, and began planning the transition that would grant me happiness. She understood mγ fear for



change and took me to The LGBT Center where I would meet Connor Maddocks. I took one look at Connor and couldn't believe he was born a biological female.

Actually seeing someone who was successful, confident, good looking and transgender changed my perspective of what I really wanted. I wanted to make a transition to feel better in my body. I wanted to stop covering the mirrors before undressing and getting into the shower. I wanted so desperately to be myself and have others understand me.

With what I have experienced and with the stories I have heard, I want to work to see more visible transgender role models in society. Real faces change perspectives, and I feel that it is my personal responsibility to provide other young trans kids with a new way of seeing their future."


To add to Anna's accomplishments, she has been honored by the Order of St. John of Jerusalem and was an Honorary Board Member of the San

MARRIAGE EQUALITY UPDATE

Although it probably almost caused Michele Bachmann to have a heart attack, same-sex marriages were recognized in Minnesota on July 1, 2013, and marriage certificates were issed beginning on August 1, 2013. Then, on October 21, there was good news in New Jersey: same-sex marriage was legalized. And just recently, on November 5th, Illinois became the 15th state to legalize marriage equality. However, the law doesn't go into effect until June, 2014. What?? Hawaii is just about there as the 16th state to legalize same-sex marriage. It was originally passed by the Senate, and then the House. There was an amendment to the bill in the House so it went back to the Senate and easily passed. Governor Neil Abercrombie already said he would sign the bill. An interesting fact that most people don't know... In 1993, Hawaii's Supreme Court shocked the United States, and much of the world, by issuing a ruling that said refusing to allow same-sex couples to marry amounted to illegal discrimination. The backlash was fierce. It was what led Congress to pass a discriminatory measure of its own, prohibiting the federal government from recognizing samesex marriage, and numerous states suddenly felt the need to amend their constitution to expressly forbid the union of two people of the same sex. Thankfully, the tide is turning. Hopefully, New Mexico will be the 17th state to get with the program by the end of the year.

DEAR HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES,

Please learn your lesson from the last election if you plan to keep your seats. While the Senate passed the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA), your House Speaker John Boehner and House Majority Leader Eric Cantor have announced that the bill is dead on arrival. It is amazing that your two leaders consistently preach discrimination. That doesn't mean you have to be lemmings and follow. Sincerely - Truth, Justice, and the American Way.

The Senate passed a bill (ENDA) on November 7 that aims to prevent discrimination against gay and transgender employees, though that only sends the measure to the House where Republican leaders have said the bill is not going anywhere.

Ten Republicans joined with Democrats to pass the proposal 64-32, which marked the first major piece of legislation involving gay rights since Congress repealed the policy barring open gays from serving in the military.

President Obama celebrated the bill's passage, saying it will stop Americans from being denied a job or fired just because they are lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender. Of course, his excitement was tempered by the fact the bill is not coming to his desk for his signature any time soon.

"One party in one house of Congress should not stand in the way of millions of Americans who want to go to work each day and simply be judged by the job they do," Mr. Obama said. "Now is the time to end this kind of discrimination in the workplace, not enable it."

Pro-gay group GetEQUAL called on President Obama to get around opposition from the House GOP by ordering that no company can do business with the U.S. government if it doesn't "voluntarily" adopt the bill's provisions. Their actual preference, which sounds pretty good, is for President Obama to sign his name to an Executive Order that would protect nearly 25 percent of this country's workforce from workplace discrimination. And, actually, The White House has not ruled out the possibility of the President using his executive power to sign ENDA into law. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid suggested that is one way to get around Congress.


THE NUTCRACKER (MEN IN TIGHTS!)


