"I made San Diego my last home via Chicago, Los Angeles, Oklahoma, back to Los Angeles, and Sonoma County. While still in Sonoma, when my youngest son was 19 years old, he told my second husband and me that he was gay. I never had a problem with his being gay, but his father could not and would not accept it. He also blamed me for "making" him gay. To this day, my son and his father do not have any kind of a relationship. After 28 years of marriage, he and I were divorced in 2004. In 2009. I moved to San Diego to be close to two of my children and my granddaughter.

I am so very proud of the man my son has become. The icing on the cake is that he is a successful businessman in San Diego. He adopted an infant baby girl that is now 4 years old. To say something of his character, the birth mother picked my son and his partner to adopt her. He is a wonderful and caring father. I have the pleasure to be involved in their lives, and I am the female figure in my granddaughter's life.

I never felt like I needed help adjusting to my son being gay; however, since I was new to San Diego and wanted to make friends and also to make a difference and help others that may have a difficult time accepting a gay child, I was introduced to PFLAG by a good friend and PFLAG member. I believe I have been able to make a difference in other peoples' road to acceptance of their children. One of my most important messages is to let members know you can certainly become a grandparent, regardless of

your child's sexual orientation.

I am now a member of the Board of Directors of PFLAG. I try to do what I can, but my life is so full with my children, granddaughter, and my Dad, who is 102 years old and still doing well. He lives in Los Angeles. I try to go there to see him and other family members at least once a month. I am a good cook (I have been told) and love having family dinners. I do a pretty good job baking banana bread for my son to sell at his coffee house. I also volunteer every week in Mama's Kitchen Pantry which allows people with a diagnosis of HIV/AIDS to shop once a month for canned fruits. vegetables, pasta, canned meats, etc. to supplement their grocery shopping for the month.

My life is full and I am a happy, healthy person that plans to be around for a long time and continue to use my life experiences to help others as much as possible."


OUT AT THE FAIR


