THE TIME IS APPROACHING

Gabriel is the epitome of a person who

pulled himself up by his bootstraps. To say he is a productive member of society is an understatement.

"Thank you for affording me the opportunity to apply for the PFLAG 2014 scholarship. I am a 23-year-old gay, HIV-positive, Mexican American student currently attending San Diego City College. I am the first in my family to ever receive a high school diploma and attend college. The end of Fall, 2013, I completed my first semester of college as a full time student with a GPA of 4.0. I successfully completed Stepping Stone residential alcohol and drug treatment facility on July 6, 2013 and am now living at Enva House, HIV sober living run by Stepping Stone. I was motivated to continue my education after completing my first semester of college and work towards becoming a social worker in the LGBTQ community. I would like to work with youth affected by alcohol and drug addiction, homelessness, HIV, Hepatitis-C, and the underserved Latino community.

I would like to tell you a little bit about myself and my life, which has gotten me to this point of applying for your scholarship. I was raised in Oceanside, CA and lived there until the age of 14. My parents divorced when I was 9 years of age, which was extremely difficult for me. My mother left my sister and me to be raised by my father. At this point, my life began to fall apart. We were no longer allowed to meet with my mother unless court approved. I became very distant to my father for putting my sister and me in the middle of their battles.

Several years prior to this lifechanging event, I began to realize that I was gay and became severely depressed; I had no one to talk to this about. I used alcohol and drugs as a way to suppress these feelings that I felt were abnormal and wrong for being a gay man. There were times I thought about ending my life. Somehow I was able to graduate Rancho Buena Vista High School in June of 2008, the same month I turned 18, and decided to move in with my mom who lived San Diego.

I was living in San Diego as a young adult with no positive gay role models. Shortly after entering the gay lifestyle, my drug use increased as I sought sex. acceptance, validation, and friendship with older men. By November of 2008 I because sick and was hospitalized at Scripps. My mother came to visit and the doctor came in to talk to both of us privately about me becoming HIV positive. My mom, at that point, had no idea I was gay and using drugs daily. My mother and I were extremely scared and had no one to talk about my HIV and drug addiction. Was I going to die from my HIV? Were drugs the only way to help me address my feelings? Would I ever be loved? Am I damaged goods?

I went back home with my mother and my life spiraled out of control; she had no idea what to do with me. My mother got tired of the lies and my lack of care for her and my sister. The drugs and gay lifestyle had overcome me. Her only way of knowing how to handle the situation was to throw me out of her house. I believe if my mother was aware that PFLAG existed, she may have had the support and guidance necessary to better address my existence as a gay male. The only place I had to go was with the men I would meet on sex hookup sites online. I became angry and resentful at my life and simply didn't care. I was taken advantage of by many men, had sex to get around and be able to stay off the streets, and coped with drugs. I moved in with an ex-boyfriend who introduced me to IV drug using. This was his form of keeping me with him. I was unable to have any sober thoughts and was in a state of highinduced drug affects. This went on for months until I was able to snap out of

it and build a form of tolerance.

Feeling sick and deteriorated, I needed help and my health needed severe care. I was taken to AVRC [AntiViral Research Center at UCSD] where I met Anthony Johnson, a man who would change my life and become my HIV case manager. Although I continued to use drugs, Anthony never gave up on me. I would see him when I was on the streets high and he always came up to check on me. Since meeting Anthony, I was thrown in jail numerous times and tried several times to get into Stepping Stone. Something deep inside me told me that I deserved to live a better life and be happy with who I was. In January 2013 I contacted my case manager and told him I was ready to do whatever was necessary to change my life before I died on the streets. I was admitted into Stepping Stone on February 6, 2013 and my life has forever changed. I was introduced to my HIV counselor, Chris Mueller. With the help of both Anthony and Chris, they were able to provide the constant love and support necessary to have the life I have today. Today I have been one-year and two-months clean and sober. My mother is my best friend and along with other friends who are clean and sober, I have all the support I need in my life.

Today I have a part time job at Urban Body Gym and Juice Bar in the morning, performing gym maintenance and attend school in the afternoon. I volunteer for San Diego AIDS Walk, Transgender Day of Empowerment, talk to newly diagnosed adolescent clients at UCSD mother, child, and adolescent program, take residents from Stepping Stone to medical appointments, volunteer for sober events in the community, and, most importantly, I now sponsor someone in the AA program. I also serve as the Alumni Liaison to the residents of Stepping Stone on the Board of Stepping Stone Alumni Association."


