We are pleased to spotlight our own Kathie Moehlig, North County Inland facilitator and, to us and many others in San Diego, a true hero to

the Trans\* community. She founded and is Executive Director of Trans Family Support Services. There are groups who support and help Trans\* individuals, but, Kathie feels there are needs that specifically relate to the complex issues that come with being a family with one or more transgender members. Right now, those needs are going unmet. That's exactly what Trans Family Support Services is focused on addressing.

As a parent advocate, she navigated his admittance to the clinic and has worked tirelessly to help other transgender youth and families through the journey.

Kathie is a certified life coach, a licensed minister, and a certified parent counselor. She provides compassionate and informative support for transgender families and friends.

#### **NEXT ON THE HIT PARADE**



Mariel Hoac is the recipient of the Raytheon STEM Scholarship. Mariel was the perfect candidate: she graduated from the School of Engineering, Innovation and Design as part of the Kearny High Educational Complex. In addition, while maintaining her 4.04 GPA, she

participated in the Fast Track program, taking courses at Mesa College. She is currently a freshman at the University of California, Berkeley.

Mariel's other achievements include being the Co-Founder and Secretary of the Gender Sexuality Alliance, President of CANstruction (this is an after school club that is using the medium of canned food to create an artistic structure. After competition, all of the canned food goes to local food banks), a member of EID Ambassadors, Secretary of Robotics, involved in the CA Scholarship Foundation, Ladies Leadership, and is the student rep for the PTSA. Mariel's essay:

"Of the vast majority of issues that surrounds the LGBT+ community, one of the toughest that I have had to confront is falling into stereotypes. Due to a gene that causes the hair on my head to be very thick, having a hairstyle where my hair is long is very undesirable for warm temperatures. It is because of the hassle of having long, thick hair, that as I entered into high school, a period of time where I have discovered and explored who I am as a person, that I slowly cut my hair shorter and shorter until the sides of my hair had the same zero shaved look as my brother. The comfort and advantages of having such a haircut proved to be a good decision until I realized people started to justify my decision based on my sexuality or question my sexuality based on my haircut. With rumors spread around underclassman, curious to know whether or not they were true and good friends making what they thought were just jokes, I started to have bouts of regret. Though it is true I may be a young, gay woman who happens to have short hair, knowing that there is still ignorance reining the opinions of people in my immediate environment, some of these people being good friends who hide their judgment but not well enough for me to not notice or feel. I have felt what it is like to fall under a stereotype and feel like how I have chosen to express myself has only further perpetuated it rather than help me show who I feel like I am.

Though I do still struggle with the whispers and looks I get that I know are based on how I have chosen to cut my hair, the drive to feel safe and unjudged helped me gain the confidence to start a GSA (Gender & Sexuality Alliance) on my school's campus. With the support of friends and family, I, along with friends who feel the same need to provide a safer community on campus for LGBT+ students, founded Kearny High's GSA this past October. Despite having a slow

start and no direction of how to begin, we immediately found our first meeting having a number of about 30 participants. Our numbers have dwindled down to a dedicated and delightful group of 15, but already I can feel the differences opening up this space have had. In one specific case, a young, quiet freshman, who I had never expected to attend every meeting as he has now, has seemed to grow more comfortable with accepting who he is and has found where he can do this. This was evident when a bonfire gathering for GSA's from other high schools took place this last winter. The freshman, who attended the gathering, returned from the bonfire excitedly and even offered to host another one at his home. Though this small action of seeing someone get excited after a hangout with friends is not very grand and would have easily gone unnoticed by everyone else, witnessing how one of the members of my GSA has already found a more comfortable and safe place to express themselves freely and be around others that can relate to their story, I can feel the rewards that this club can and will bring to all of its members. Though still very small, the club has already proven that it has the potential to grow and expand its influence over Kearny High's campus.

From the experience of founding a club that provides an open space for education and discussion of LGBT+ issues/ subjects, I find that my interests lead me to wanting to be a future advocate for the LGBT+ community on my college campus. I may not have a concrete direction in which I would like to study in during my college years, though engineering as my original interest holds rein over my major currently, I find that as I explore to find the major that suits me, I will always find time to become an activist in helping deplete the ignorance of those who do not fully understand the issues that the LGBT+ community must face. As I have faced my own personal issues and found how I can help others' overcome their own, this scholarship will help me explore the areas of study that can help me achieve my goals."

# **PFLAG YEAR IN REVIEW 2015**

#### **MONTHLY GENERAL MEETINGS**

We have four additional support groups with similar programs that meet monthly throughout San Diego County: North County Coastal in Oceanside, North County Inland in Rancho Bernardo, East County in Santee, and Asian-Pacific Islander in San Diego. Patti Boman, from the South Bay Support Group, offers support to individuals upon request. We also support a Spanish speaking group, Mi Familia, who meet monthly at The LGBT Center.

#### PROGRAMS (SAN DIEGO METRO)

**PFLAG documentary – Holding Families Together:** We were able to "re-share" the documentary we made in 2010.

**Guest Speaker a.t. furuya:** a.t. shared personal experiences as a Japanese-American graduate student.

**Guest Speaker lan Morton:** We were fortunate to have lan, from the San Diego Human Dignity Foundation, give us the scoop on the 2015 new and improved scholarship program.

**YouTube video:** The video, based on John Corvino's book, *What's Morally Wrong with Homosexuality?* showed us in a light, but serious manner, what we all knew: NOTHING! NOTHING is WRONG.

*Our own Dynamic Duo:* PFLAG SDC Board President, Terrie Vorono, and Board Member, Linda Gohlke, gave us an update on what the San Diego Unified School District is doing (or not doing) concerning LGBT rights and anti-bullying measures.

**Guest Speaker Susan Cottrell:** Susan is co-founder of FreedHearts, helping faith parents learn to unconditionally love, accept and affirm their LGBTQ children.

Guest Speaker Doc (Skip) Faulkner: Skip shared his theology, theater, and psychology background with us.

**Guest Speaker Fernando Lopez, Jr.:** LGBT History 101 was ably taught by Fernando, who even gave us a test, which opened our eyes. Who knew?

#### PROGRAMS (NORTH COUNTY COASTAL)

Guest Speakers Amanda Cook and Joshua Coyne: Amanda and Joshua are from The Trevor Project, the leading national organization providing crisis intervention and suicide prevention services to LGBTQ young people, ages 13-24.

**Guest Speaker Carolyn Bolton:** As Board Chair of the North County LGBTQ Resource Center, Carolyn presented portions of Breaking the Silence, a training program she designed to increase awareness and create safe zone certified schools. Training was in progress with the Oceanside Unified School District.

**Guest Speaker Michelle Powers:** Michelle is the Facilitator of Valuing Our Families. She shared her experience and journey as the parent of a gender nonconforming child.


