# THE MORE YOU KNOW

GLAAD (formerly the Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation) is the world's LGBTQ media advocacy organization. They launched the Trump Accountability Project (TAP). TAP will equip and serve as a resource for journalists, newsrooms, editors, producers, and other news makers reporting on the Trump administration. TAP will catalogue the anti-LGBTQ statements, as well as negative statements made regarding the black community, women, immigrants, Muslims and other communities and ideas.

The bulk of information will include firsthand statements, video, and/or audio to document the animus displayed by Trump, his appointees, and future appointees. The Trump administration must be held accountable for their words and actions.

It is no secret that Trump and friends blatantly pledged to dismantle the legal protections that LGBTQ people, as well as other communities, have achieved over the past several years.

# **JUSTICE HAS BEEN SERVED**


After North Carolina Governor Pat McCrory insisted he won re-election on November 8, despite facts to the contrary, he finally conceded to Roy Cooper, the state's attorney general. It took nearly a month to do so. McCrory demanded a recount, which did not go in his favor.

Now for the best part, which will hopefully be reversed: McCrory lost votes in urban areas because of his strong support for House Bill 2, the controversial law that among other provisions requires transgender people in government facilities to use the bathroom that corresponds to their birth certificates. HB2 has prompted numerous sporting events to be moved outside North Carolina, as well as

conferences, concerts, and some corporate expansions – resulting in millions of dollars in economic losses. Opponents of the law made McCrory their main target, and the national LGBT advocacy group, Human Rights Campaign, was one of the first groups to celebrate the governor's concession speech on December 5.

"Pat McCrory's reign of discrimination is finally over," Human Rights Campaign President Chad Griffin said in a news release. "McCrory's stubborn and reckless support of HB2 cost him this election, and his defeat sends a powerful warning to lawmakers across the country that targeting LGBTQ people will not be tolerated."

Can't wait until the Non Sequitur strip will be a thing of the past.

# **WE'RE GETTING THERE!**



Jairo Leon was awarded one of the PFLAG Merit Scholarships. As you will see from his essay, he seems to be a one-person show. Before attending UCLA, he was very active in the LGBTQ community at CSU San Marcos. Along with a professor, he developed lectures focused on queer masculinity and sexuality. He served as a

discussion leader who independently facilitated bi-weekly dialogues with 20 students about queer films and theory. Jairo worked on campus in the Gender Equality Center and the LGBTQ Pride Center. While there, he organized a conference that included participation by LGBTQ scholars from numerous higher education institutions. Jairo has spoken about immigration and the challenges faced by undocumented queer youth at several education venues, including the Thomas Jefferson School of Law. For his leadership roles in both Centers, in 2015, he received the Growing Tree Award. Jairo also founded the Cougar Dream Scholarship which raises money, disseminates scholarship funding, and provides mentoring to undocumented students pursuing their education at CSU San Marco. To put icing on the cake, he was selected to participate in the Young Professionals Council at the San Diego LGBT Community Center.

"I am proud to have taken on the 2015 Co-lead of Development role within the San Diego Dream Team (SDDT), an undocumented, youth-led immigrant rights group. This volunteer position gave me the opportunity to serve a community whose challenges I know firsthand. Sustaining effective internal organization and fundraising were my primary responsibilities. As a team leader, however, I also took part in presenting at San Diego high schools and colleges on undocumented issues, lobbying alongside the ACLU to break police and border patrol partnerships, and organizing DACA clinics, which was especially rewarding. During these clinics we invited community members to meet with immigration attorneys and receive assistance with filling out the forms required to apply for the federal program, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). DACA status provides eligible immigrants protection from deportation and authorization to work in the United States for two years, with the option to renew. My specific role was to organize the logistics of the clinics: find a location, contact and request pro-bono participation from an appropriate number of attorneys, ensure we had enough volunteers to have a smooth operation, coordinate flyer creation and distribution, order food for volunteers and attorneys, and maintain our supplies (enough DACA forms and folders, printer paper and ink for copying supporting documents, pencils, highlighters, whiteout...etc.). I enjoyed meeting and assisting my fellow community members.

Given that DACA application requires a \$456 filing fee, it became apparent that financial barriers kept some from applying. Therefore, SDDT decided to hold a DACA scholarship fundraiser last March, which I spearhead. This involved, in part, sustained a working relationship with our primary underwriter, Hitzke Development, inviting Pilgrim Church to attend and give by addressing the entire Sunday congregation, and sharing my story in the event's program, California State Senator Ricardo Lara recognized my work that night with a personal award. We raised a total of \$5,000. As a member of SDDT, I also joined the planning committee for the 3rd Annual UndocuGrads conference hosted at UC Merced. This conference focused on providing undocumented undergraduates with tools and resources to successfully apply for graduate studies. I was involved in deciding the overall theme and organization of the conference, writing requests for funds to UC partners, and shared advice on writing a personal statement.

I would have never thought of being this involved in the undocumented movement a mere four years ago. I will always be thankful to Diana and Carolina Valdivia for showing me the liberating value of being undocumented and unapologetic. Once I found pride in my sexuality, affirming my undocumented status had to follow. That's when the Valdivia sisters brought me to the SDDT. I have felt at home with them, especially as they incorporated feminist and queer philosophies. Any ambivalence I felt in publically associating myself with the Team was broken by the inspiring work we have accomplished. In the context of dehumanizing policies, the Team taught me I could positively alter the world around me, regardless of my status.



I now aim to earn a Master's in Student Affairs from UCLA because as a mission orientated individual, I am dedicated to creating opportunities for underserved college students to build in capacity,

resources, and knowledge. After working as a Peer Educator, I became particularly drawn to the work of multicultural centers in this field. These centers can uniquely address student needs, and advance student development, given their continuous and varied engagement with them. Indeed, the combination of co-curricular learning, leadership building, and community outreach in these student centers speaks to my own strengths and values. These programs ignite and nourish essential self and societal exploration, while also increasing retention and graduation rates, as they elevate the overall student experience."

# **COMMUNITY EDUCATION**

We have a Speakers Bureau that is available to colleges, high schools, hospitals, businesses, and community groups. It is our main way of fulfilling our education mission. We are all proud of our enthusiastic cadre of speakers who volunteer month after month and year after year to enlighten the public about our LGBTQIA children and family members. The Speakers Bureau is made up primarily of parents of LGBTQ children and LGBTQ children who are willing to share their stories and educate those in attendance. This has lead to many a change of heart and opening of minds. The most visible presence was speaking to a large number of GSAs (newly named Genders & Sexualities Alliance) in San Diego County and beyond. 
