DAY OF SILENCE

On Friday, **April 21**, GLSEN (formerly Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network) will be supporting the 27th year of Day of Silence. This student-led national event organized in thousands of schools, bringing awareness to the silencing effects of anti-LGBTQ name-calling, bullying, and harassment in schools. Students from middle school to college take a vow of silence in an effort to encourage schools and classmates to address the problem of anti-LGBTQ behavior by illustrating the silencing effect of bullying and harassment on LGBTQ students and those perceived to be LGBTQ. It seems so much more important this year given the renewed legislative attacks on the LGBT community. Among the worst offenses is the federal government's decision to rescind school guidance on transgender students. The rise in anti-gay rhetoric has lit a fire in GSAs across the country.

A SAD DAY FOR THE LGBTQ COMMUNITY

The United States Senate triggered the so-called "nuclear option" that allowed Republicans to break a Democratic filibuster of Supreme Court nominee Neil Gorsuch. The following day, it was passed by the House of Representatives.

The controversial changes to Senate rules, made along partisan lines, allows filibusters of Supreme Court picks to be broken with only 51 votes rather than 60.

There were a host of reasons why people in the LGBTQ community didn't want Gorsuch elected to the U.S. Supreme Court. He refused to affirm the legal reasoning underlying the court's interpretation of constitutional protections for the LGBTQ community. Gorsuch has also endorsed the view that religious beliefs can justify discrimination, even when others are harmed. Now that he is on the Supreme Court, he could jeopardize the LGBTQ community's hard-won achievements of basic freedom and constitutional rights.

Gorsuch is deeply skeptical of the fundamental constitutional rights already recognized by the Supreme Court that ensure fair and equal treatment for LGBTQ people. The fact that the cases striking down anti-sodomy laws (*Lawrence v. Texas*) and recognizing marriage equality (*Obergefell v. Hodges*) have already been decided should not make the community complacent. Right now there is a concerted effort by anti-LGBTQ organizations and elected officials to nullify *Obergefell* by contending that while it may require states to issue marriage licenses to same-sex couples, it does not require equal treatment of married same-sex couples. There is a grave concern that Judge Gorsuch would permit

Obergefell and other decisions involving fundamental rights to be effectively nullified. He has already taken an incredibly broad view of religious liberty, one that allows virtually anyone who expresses a religious objection to opt out of laws with which they disagree. His ruling in the Hobby Lobby case (involving employee access to contraceptive coverage) before it reached the Supreme Court gave no consideration to the employees' health care needs and instead endorsed a view of "complicity" that is sweeping and alarming. Under his reasoning, a religious objection to doing something that might even indirectly facilitate conduct that violates the objector's faith, is enough to allow for an opt-out. Religious refusals have long been a significant problem in the realm of reproductive health care, and we now see such refusals surfacing around nondiscrimination laws and the right to marry, which are core concerns for the LGBTQ community. Private businesses are fighting in court for the right to deny services to same-sex couples, states are introducing laws to allow sweeping religious opt-outs from nondiscrimination laws, and employers are citing Hobby Lobby to justify firing transgender employees. This is a huge setback having Gorsuch on the Supreme Court, as there could be serious consequences to the equality of LGBTQ people.

LET THEM EAT DIRT

Usually, money speaks, but apparently, not in North Carolina. Besides legislatures not having a moral compass, they don't care that their state had already lost millions of dollars with the signing of HB 2 (the bathroom bill). Lawmakers were to have repealed it at the end of December; that didn't happen, but what did happen a couple months later, was the new bill, HB 142, which was really a new installment of HB 2. The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) said they would continue to boycott basketball games being held in North Carolina unless HB 2 were repealed. Knowing this, the state legislatures scrambled to meet the NCAA's deadline of April 6 to repeal it. They hatched HB 142 to appease the NCAA and some major corporations, conferences, events, entertainment and other sporting events to prevent more lost revenue, but the bill still discriminates against LGBT persons. Besides the NCAA, Bank of America and the NC Chamber of Congress, as well as others, fell for it. North Carolina got to have their cake and eat it, too. They are fine to stand to lose over 4 billion dollars even with the new bill, but as long as they continue to lawfully discriminate, they are as happy as clams. There was hope and a promise that newly elected Democrat Governor Roy Cooper would get HR 2 repealed, but all he did was sell out the LGBT community by signing into law HR 142. He called it a compromise, but it is anything but. It opens the door to discriminatory laws across the U.S.; other states could be empowered to draft similar legislation. In fact, it gives legs to the Texas Protection Act (which is just the opposite) which has already passed the state senate. It is similar to HB 142.

LGBT advocates, some lawmakers and large corporations who do business in North Carolina say House Bill 142 is not a true repeal, and still exposes gay and transgender people to discrimination. The semi-bright side is that the bill eliminates HB 2's requirement that transgender people use restrooms corresponding to the sex on their birth certificates in many public buildings. However, the new law also makes clear that from now on, only state legislators - not local governments or school officials - can make rules for public restrooms. Previously, the city of Charlotte had their own anti-discrimination laws. No more. With HB 142, besides rest room rules, this bill limits the ability of local governments to pass any LGBT anti-discrimination laws period, including the workplace. This will remain in effect until December 2020.

The ACLU said it's continuing its legal battle on behalf of transgender residents, as the discrimination significantly impacts them. They remain worried about their safety.

On a positive note, Washington, DC and some major cities are keeping a government travel ban to North Carolina.

OY VEY!

The Human Rights Campaign has called on senators not to approve Trump's choice for Secretary of the Army, Mark Green. As HRC reiterated, Green built his political career on hateful attacks against LGBTQ people and is a danger to every LGBTQ enlisted soldier. He encouraged the state of Tennessee to deny marriage licenses to same-sex couples after the Supreme Court ruled in Obergefell v. Hodges, (Marriage Equality). He characterized being transgender as a "disease," and supports license to discriminate laws that target LGBTQ people. His response? It's just politics!
