The Mary Wagner Memorial Scholarship is our longest running scholarship – 18 years! Friends of Mary Wagner, Art and Marilyn Carpenter and Sharon Murphy, have made this annual scholarship possible. The recipient is **Sydney Sterling**, who recently graduated from Madison High School. She is headed to UC Santa Barbara where she will major in Film and Media Studies. Her goal is to become a professional screenwriter.



After reading her essay, you will understand why.

Sydney's Letter of Recommendation stated that, besides being an excellent student, she is curious with a "think outside the box" view. She's an anti-conformist with the gumption to express her ideas. Sydney's essay:

"I grew up in a liberal and politically active household. My dad would always talk to me about events going on in our country and the world, would take me to protests and demonstrations, and would make sure the talk radio we listened to was

strictly progressive. I entered middle school as Occupy San Diego (OSD) began, and as soon as I learned what it stood for, I knew this would be the next cause I joined. OSD was different from any other movement I had known. OSD stood against the banks and with the people. We supplied food, shelter, and other services to dozens of homeless who came to the Civic Center Plaza. This was where OSD organized and set up camp. OSD and the people involved in it spoke to me on such a personal level, that for the next several years I made Occupy San Diego one of my highest priorities. Knowing about the corruption and greed that was occurring in our government, I couldn't stand idly by and not take action. During the time I spent in OSD, I was eager to help make whatever difference was possible locally for the homeless and the others we served throughout the community. People see the injustices of the world and do nothing about them. Unless it impacts them or their families directly, they feel as if they don't need to get involved. Well, that isn't the kind of person I want to be.

Occupy not only taught me about issues within our government, but I learned about issues impacting the LGBT community. Through OSD, I became aware of the struggles that queer people in San Diego face. Being a lesbian, I tend to be drawn to media that has gueer characters because I like to see people from my demographic in what I watch. The only problem with this is that I often feel disappointed with how films and television shows portray queer characters. When a character is gay, that is usually all you know about them. It's offensive when a character's only defining and driving characteristic is their sexuality. Well-written characters are dynamic, change as the plot moves forward, and have both good and bad qualities just as real people do. When gay characters are written to only be gay and nothing else, it sends a message that gay people are solely composed of their sexuality and that's all anyone needs to know about them. I struggle to find accurate representation in media every day. But representation does not mean including a character that is not only stereotypical but also the only gay character. Seeing this in film and TV only makes me more excited to be a screenwriter. I'm going to write characters whose sexuality only makes up part of a very complex and layered personality. In the future, when gay youth turn on the TV and see others like them on the screen, all that they see won't be stereotypes.

At UCSB, I can take the knowledge and leadership skills that I've learned through Occupy San Diego and help to educate my fellow students on political and LGBT issues. I have seen first-hand the effects of corruption within a society, and I can show others why it's important to be involved in their community and stand up for their rights and beliefs."

PRIDE WEEKEND REMINDERS

July 14 (Friday): Spirit of Stonewall Rally and Awards at the Hillcrest Pride Flag (see article on Kathie Moehlig being honored); July 15 (Saturday): At 9:30 am, Front Runners and Walkers will have their Pride 5K Run/Walk; July 15 (Saturday): The Pride Parade begins at 11:00 am. There is parking at the Balboa Naval Hospital, located on Park Blvd. across from President's Way with free shuttle bus service to the beginning of the route. Be at the buses early, as they back up and you'll be waiting in line so long that you'll miss part of the parade; Pride Festival is July 15 after the parade until July 16 at 8:00 pm.

The festival is located at Marston Point at 6th and Laurel in Balboa Park. All tickets are \$20 (+\$1.75 service charge if purchased online) and are good for both days of the Pride Festival. To purchase tickets: www.sdpride.org. At the Festival, tickets are \$25.00.
