SPOTLIGHT ON KATHIE MOEHLIG



PFLAG San Diego County and TransFamily Support Services are proud to be part of Kathie's world. The following is an excerpt from an article that appeared in the April 22 issue of the San Diego Union-Tribune. The U-T conducts one-on-one interviews with notable local people.

"Kathie Moehlig has spent 20 years as a life coach and earned additional training as a parenting instructor, drug and alcohol treatment counselor, and as an ordained minister. All of that training, she believes, led to her current role as founder and executive director of TransFamily Support Services. When her own son, Sam, started his transition, there was one local support group available, but not much else. Her family couldn't find any local doctors who were treating transgender youth, either. Once the Moehligs started their journey, other parents began reaching out to her asking for help and guidance."

As a way of introduction, Kathie explains that TransFamily Support Services is a non-profit organization that serves

transgender and non-binary folks and their families. They provide navigation for this very challenging journey. Kathie notes that research shows higher suicide rates among these youth who have no parental acceptance and support, versus those who have the support of at least one parent. The objective is to guide parents with education, support, and resources to be able to move to acceptance and being a support for their youth.

Much of Kathie's work includes: training families, schools, the medical and legal communities, and government agencies how to be supportive and helpful to those who identify as trans and non-binary. THE LONELIEST GIRL IN THE WORLD

Appearing from **May 24-June 24** is a new, award-winning musical at the Diversionary Theatre. Synopsis: Following the life and evolution of Anita Bryant and her biggest fan, Tommy, *The Loneliest Girl in the World* magically charts the emergence of the gay rights movement on urgently intimate terms. By turns delightful and provocative, this inspiring new musical is a reminder of a battle yet won, the purpose of pie, and the power of an individual voice.

For those of you too young to remember, Anita Bryant was the lead advocate for Save our Children, a political coalition that was against gays and lesbians (then referred to as homosexuals) and sought to overturn an ordinance that prohibited discrimination in housing, employment, and public accommodation. Said Bryant, "What these people really want, hidden behind obscure legal phrases, is the legal right to propose to our children that theirs is an acceptable alternate way of life. I will lead such a crusade to stop it as this country has not seen before."

During an October, 1977, press conference in Des Moines, lowa, while reporters were questioning Bryant about her national crusade against homosexuals, gay rights activist

Tom Higgins threw a pie in Bryant's face, prompting her to pray for Higgins' salvation. At the time of the incident, she and her cohorts said this would hurt the gay cause and that *Rolling Stone Magazine* was there to report it.

Back then, Bryant was a brand ambassador for Florida orange juice to promote the juice. She was put in her place when the gay community retaliated against the campaign by boycotting orange juice produced in Florida. Gay bars stopped selling screwdrivers and instead sold Anita Bryants, made with vodka and apple juice, the proceeds from which went to a fund that would help to fight against Bryant.

As a result, Bryant lost her contract with the Florida Citrus Commission, her marriage failed, and fundamentalist audiences and venues shunned her as she was no longer allowed to attend their events. As it's been said time and time again, "Don't mess with the gay community." This is definitely a play you would not want to miss.
