SPOTLIGHT ON SEAN REDMOND

Sean Redmond was born and raised in the small community of Omak, Washington. From an early age, he was taught civic pride and service toward the community. He is an Eagle Scout and Vigil member of the Order of the Arrow. He continued his service into the US Air Force where he served 20 years in law enforcement and human resource development. After retirement in 2009, he moved to San Diego where he pursued his vision of working to improve and being part of a bigger community family. In particular, was his desire is to serve the LGBT veteran community. As the modern LGBT military community changes, he is there to provide support, resources, and education through such programs as the San Diego Unified School District Youth Advocacy Program. Using his law enforcement experience and community policing desire, he is very active in the Stonewall Citizens' Patrol. As the Board of Directors appointed Executive Director, he can continue his drive to educate and provide community safety to the diverse neighborhoods of Bankers Hill, Hillcrest, North Park, and University Heights. Sean has a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice Administration/Cyber Crime Security and continues to pursue educational opportunities in public administration and youth advocacy.

Sean also serves as the Director of Safety & Welfare for the San Diego Gay Men's Chorus, is on the Advisory Council for the LGBT Veterans Wall of Honor, is the Festival Co-Manager for Pride 2019, and volunteers with Gay for Good-San Diego, Mama's Kitchen, and San Diego Fire Department Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Hillcrest/University Heights. He and his husband, Jackson Redmond, live in Hillcrest with their rescue fur kid, Artie.


